Telehandler Training Courses Victoria - The employer has the responsibility to make certain that their personnel are trained to work competently with telehandler machines. The employees should be assessed for their skill to make use of the equipment. If deficiencies are found, employers must provide training so that employees get the necessary level of skill. The responsibility level of the individual must be considered when training is provided. Effective training would remedy whatever deficiencies in the knowledge, skills and understanding of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training can be undertaken through in-house session or by engaging the services of an external training provider. An assessment upon finishing the training period would determine whether or not the learning objectives have been met.

Regulations and guidelines for the basic telehandler operator training and testing are set by local, federal and state/provincial regulators. Basic training does not deal with such topics as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of people, the use of rotating equipment or the use of other attachments. Further training must be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work location.

Inspection and maintenance

Like any machinery, a telehandler needs effective maintenance. The machine inevitably will suffer wear sooner or later. Correct maintenance is vital to ensuring safe utilization of the telehandler machine. Checks and inspections are vital to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators must have machine-specific training in order to prevent, rectify and monitor problems connected with damage, wear and deterioration. Workers require experience and competence in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions should be viewed seriously and followed, considering such factors as frequency of use and environmental conditions in the work setting.

The responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler and its attachments are in good working order lies with both the user and owner of the machinery. General maintenance is normally carried out by the telehandler owner while pre-use inspections are typically performed by the user.
